

General Comments and/or Add'l Areas Needing Improvement PBCFR Command staff and PBC engineering & zoning GIS quickly integrated 1,000's of data points. It became apparent that better communications between PTF and the EOC would allow for far better use of this resource. On the third shift, a face to face meeting between PTF staff and the EOC staff was required to just begin to have the two agencies function together. Earlier integration is suggested.
14. Remarks Notably, the PTF Leader and his deputy were at Station 28 for an initial briefing within 75 minutes of initial notification of tasking. Hours later, the tech makeover of our station was remarkable, with big screen map views and data streaming directly into the main center for this forward Incident Command Post (ICP). All PTF team members performed exceptionally well in a NIMS Command environment. The rapid training of field personnel from multiple agencies took less than 15 minutes, and the field results spoke for themselves. With more than 4,500 field assessments streaming into the ICP with 700+ mapped photos, our ICP Command had a far better grasp of Situational Awareness than I have witnessed before as a credentialed, Type III, IC. The entire Command Staff and IMT made full use of this actionable, field intel, and embedded tech specialists. For future, complex operations, I would recommend the use of this resource.
